ONGOING FORMATION COURSE ON MISSIONARY PASTORAL MINISTRY

The Faculty of Theology of the Salesian Pontifical University in Rome, with the support of the SDB Missions Sector, offers the 20th Ongoing Formation Course on Missionary Pastoral Ministry from September 26 to December 15, 2016.

The course offers a plan for personal growth, for deepening the Christian message and for the renewal of pastoral ministry, through a series of initiatives that include activities, lessons, moments of

sharing and reflection.

For Salesian participants the course begins with a pilgrimage to the Salesian Holy Places and participation in the giving of the missionary cross to members of the 147th missionary expedition at Valdocco. The last week will take place in the Holy Land as pilgrims in order to deepen biblical and Christological themes.



As a newly ordained bishop, the Servant of God Msgr. Stephen Ferrando (1885-1978), a missionary in India, founder of the Missionaries of Mary Help of Christians, wrote to the Rector Major, Fr. Peter Ricaldone: "Beloved Father, on November 10 I was consecrated bishop. I bless Almighty God who has looked upon my smallness so that in me his mercy may shine forth. I am a bishop, a Salesian Bishop and I have no other desire but to honour my mother, the Congregation to whom I owe everything [...] I can only recommend to your paternal heart the beloved Krishnagar mission".
